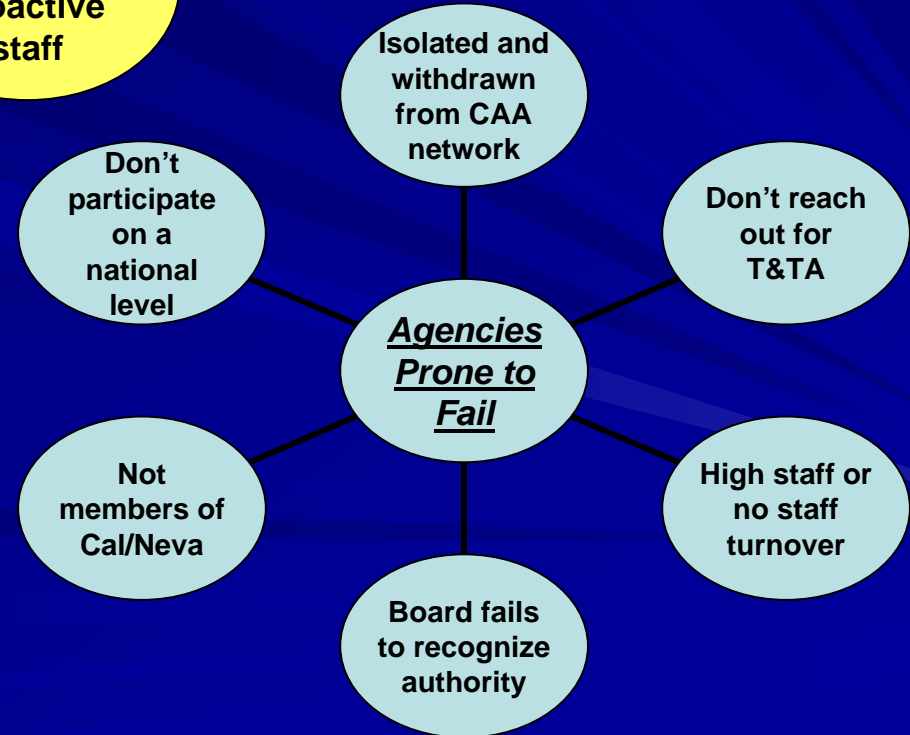

RPIC

History:

- GAO OCS T&TA Report in 2007
- OCS initiated a complete review of T&TA National Model
- Resulted in OCS Information Memorandum No. 123 & RPIC Grant:
 - OCS identified the need for enhanced coordination of national technical assistance efforts
 - OCS supported exemplary practice work groups and supplemental projects at State CAA Associations
 - OCS now believes that future T/TA efforts can be made more effective through enhanced communication structures, reduced duplication of effort, and improved coordination between national technical assistance providers, State CAA Associations, and local CSBG service providers.
